Benton™ Dark Sweet Cherry (Self-fertile)	Benton™ is an excellent self-fertile dark sweet cherry that ripens in the Bing season. The fruit has exceptional flavor that is both sweet and acidic. Blooms later than Bing. Zone 5-8	Standard E Semi-Dwf & Dwarf I
Bing Dark Sweet Cherry	Grandpa's Choice™ Bing Dark Sweet Cherry is a deep mahogany colored fruit that is firm and juicy. Known as the standard for flavor, it has meaty, purple flesh. Bing has a moderate cracking tendency, and is recommended for areas with less rainfall during harvest season. Zone 5-8	Standard D Semi-Dwf & Dwarf H
Emperor Francis Blush Sweet Cherry	Emperor Francis Blush Sweet Cherries ripen in June with an outstanding flavor. Fruit is large, high quality and yellowish-white. Trees are very hardy, productive and reliable. quite crack resistant. Zone 5-8	Standard E Semi-Dwf & Dwarf I
Kristin Dark Sweet Cherry	Kristin Dark Sweet Cherry is known for being one of the hardiest cherries. It does well in Zone 5 and in the milder parts of Zone 4. It has large dark purplish fruit approaching 1 inch, which is meaty, juicy and tasty. It is a good producer and is recommended for tough sweet cherry growing areas. BlackGold™ Dark Sweet Cherry (Self-fertile)	Grandpa's Choice™ BlackGold™ Dark Sweet Cherry is a large, black sweet cherry that ripens one week after Bing and is self-fertile and an excellent pollinator for other late blooming varieties. The tree is frost resistant and very hardy. BlackGold™ is quite crack resistant. Zone 5-8	Standard D Semi-Dwf & Dwarf H
Danube® Tart Cherry	Danube® Tart Cherry is a new cultivar for the United States. The fruit is medium to large, dark red, and sweeter than Montmorency. The trees are very productive. It ripens earlier than Montmorency and has red juice and flesh. It is great for eating out of hand or cooking. It has good keeping qualities for a tart cherry. Hedelfingen Dark Sweet Cherry	The Hedelfingen Dark Sweet Cherry is an old European variety good for fresh eating, freezing and canning. Fruit is large, firm and black. Hudson Dark Sweet Cherry	Hudson is a good, sweet black sweet cherry that is more crack-resistant than most cherries. It ripens later in the season and hangs well on the tree. It is moderately productive and hardy. Zone 5-8	Standard D Semi-Dwf & Dwarf H	
Jubileum® Tart Cherry	Jubileum® Tart Cherry is a very early maturing, dark purplish-red tart cherry variety, ripening ten days before Montmorency. Rainier Blush Sweet Cherry	Grandpa's Choice™ Rainier Blush Sweet Cherry's skin color is golden yellow with a considerable amount of red blush. The fruit is very large and firm, and it's clear colored flesh has a distinctly different flavor. The tree is vigorous, hardy, and productive. Van Dark Sweet Cherry	Van is one of the hardier sweet cherries, and will do better than Bing in the colder areas. The fruit is Bing type, but slightly smaller. Ripens a week or so after Bing. It is a naturally compact, dwarfish tree that will withstand the cold north winters and produce an abundance of tart pie cherries which are bright red. If left on the tree to hang, they will develop more sugar and become a great snacking cherry. It is self-fertile and requires no other pollinator. Gold Sweet Cherry	The Gold Sweet Cherry has small, firm fruit that is very crack resistance and has light golden skin. These trees are heavy producers and excellent pollinators that ripen in early June. Flavor is not as good as others in its season. Zone 5-8	Standard E Semi-Dwf & Dwarf I	
Lapins Dark Sweet Cherry (Self-fertile)	Lapins Dark Sweet Cherry is a firm, excellent quality, crack resistant fruit that is as large as Bing. They have a rich flavor and ripen in late July. Trees are heavy producers, self-fertile and resists late frosts. Zone 5-8	Standard D Semi-Dwf & Dwarf H	
Montmorency Tart Cherry	Grandpa's Choice™ Montmorency Tart Cherry has long been recognized as the standard of the tart cherry industry. Balaton® Tart Cherry	Balaton® Tart Cherry is an interesting tart cherry with more flavor and "body" than Montmorency. It is well flavored and is firmer and not as juicy as Montmorency. It makes a great dried tart cherry and is good for fresh eating and pies too. It ripens a week or more later than Montmorency. Zone 5-8	Standard E Semi-Dwf & Dwarf I	
English Morello Tart Cherry	English Morello is an antique tart cherry variety known for its cold hardiness and heavy cropping. Its medium size cherries have dark red flesh and juice. It is very productive and ripens about 10 days after Montmorency. Zone 5-8	Standard E Semi-Dwf & Dwarf I	
Mesabi Tart Cherry	Mesabi is a nice hardy tart cherry that resembles Meteor somewhat. The tree is dwarfish, very hardy and a heavy producer. The fruit is bright red, with pinkish-red flesh that has a sugar content between normal sweet and sour cherries. It has a small pit, ripens in mid-July and is good for sauce and pies. Meteor Tart Cherry	Meteor is a natural genetic dwarf that will grow about half as much as other tart cherries. It produces a nice, tart, juicy, meaty pie cherry that resembles Montmorency. It is extremely hardy. It blooms and ripens a week after Montmorency. Zone 3-8	Standard E Semi-Dwf & Dwarf I	

Regina™ Dark Sweet Cherry

Regina(TM) is a new dark sweet cherry bred in Europe and recently introduced to the United States. It is dark red with reddish flesh and sweet tart flavor. The large fruit is exceptionally firm and more crack and split resistant than most sweet cherries. It ripens late in the season about 10-14 days after Bing and must be pollinated by another late blooming sweet cherry. Not pollen compatible with Van. Zone 5-8
